
Sound Government Practices


Priorities include:

We will support active transportation and will work to ensure that wherever possible, amenities like streetlights, sidewalks, bike paths, crosswalks and transit stops are secured during the development process.

- 2. Accountability for capital projects
- 3. Securing more and higher quality amenities during development
- 4. Developing an active transportation network
- 5. Reducing congestion at high traffic intersections
